VFW Participates in Welcome Home Vietnam War Commemoration: VFW National Junior Vice Commander Al Lipphardt represented the VFW along with more than 90 organizations at a three-day United States of America Vietnam War Commemoration 50th anniversary welcome home celebration. Events included demonstrations from various service drill teams, the U.S. Army Golden Knights parachute team, and live musical performances.

Education Information: For any service member or veteran looking to pursue their education goals through the use of the GI Bill, there is an important tool offered by VA. The <u>GI Bill Comparison Tool</u> allows users to compare different programs and institutions. In the past few years, some student veterans have been impacted by the abrupt closures of the schools they were attending. These schools were using predatory business practices and had numerous complaints against them. The tool gives users the ability to check the schools they wish to attend and provides up-to-date data received from current and past students. This information can help GI Bill users make better, more informed decisions about where to attend school, and hopefully avoid programs that offer little to no value.

WASHINGTON — The VFW is actively following the recent news that nearly two dozen homeless veterans were suddenly forced to find alternate temporary housing when suburban New York City hotels, to include the Crossroads Hotel in Newburgh, said they could no longer accommodate them. The VFW is deeply troubled by reports indicating the move was in effort to turn a higher profit by offering these rooms for government use.

The VFW Department of New York remains actively engaged with state government, local municipalities, and regional VA offices to ensure the needs of these veterans are being addressed, and on Wednesday VFW representatives will attend a State Veterans Council meeting where the Commissioner of the New York City Department of Veterans Services will provide a status update.

Through a continued partnership with Humana, the VFW Department of New York, remains committed to alleviating veterans homelessness and food insecurity, raising and donating nearly \$80,000 to shelters throughout the state in 2021-2022.

Nationally, the VFW remains committed to helping combat veterans homelessness and actively advocates for increased funding for HUD-VASH vouchers, grant and per diem payments, and pilot programs geared to assist veterans in their time of need. BATTLE OF THE MONTH



The **Battle of the Little Bighorn**, known to the <u>Lakota</u> and other <u>Plains Indians</u> as the **Battle of the Greasy Grass**,^[1] and commonly referred to as **Custer's Last Stand**, was an armed engagement between combined forces of the <u>Lakota Sioux</u>, <u>Northern Cheyenne</u>, and <u>Arapaho</u> tribes and the <u>7th Cavalry Regiment</u> of the <u>United</u> <u>States Army</u>. The battle, which resulted in the defeat of U.S. forces, was the most significant action of the <u>Great</u> <u>Sioux War of 1876</u>. It took place on June 25–26, 1876, along the <u>Little Bighorn River</u> in the <u>Crow Indian Reserva-</u> <u>tion</u> in southeastern <u>Montana Territory</u>.^[2]

Most battles in the Great Sioux War, including the Battle of the Little Bighorn, were on lands those Indians had taken from other tribes since 1851.^{[3][4][5][6]} The Lakotas were there without consent from the local Crow tribe, which had treaty on the area. Already in 1873, Crow chief Blackfoot had called for U.S. military actions against the Indian intruders.^{[7][8]} The steady Lakota invasion (a reaction to encroachment in the Black Hills) into treaty areas belonging to the smaller tribes^[9] ensured the United States a firm Indian alliance with the <u>Arikaras^[10]</u> and the <u>Crows</u> during the Lakota Wars.^{[11][12][13]}

The fight was an overwhelming victory for the Lakota, Northern Cheyenne, and Arapaho, who were led by several major war leaders, including <u>Crazy Horse</u> and <u>Chief Gall</u>, and had been inspired by the visions of <u>Sitting</u> <u>Bull</u> (*Tňatňáŋka Íyotake*). The U.S. 7th Cavalry, a force of 700 men, suffered a major defeat while commanded by <u>Lieutenant Colonel George Armstrong Custer</u> (a <u>brevetted major general</u> during the <u>American Civil War</u>). Five of the 7th Cavalry's twelve companies were wiped out and Custer was killed, as were two of his brothers, a nephew, and a brother-in-law. The total U.S. casualty count included 268 dead and 55 severely wounded (six died later from their wounds),^{[14]:244} including four <u>Crow</u> Indian scouts and at least two <u>Arikara</u> Indian scouts.

Public response to the <u>Great Sioux War</u> varied in the immediate aftermath of the battle. <u>Libbie Custer</u>, Custer's widow, soon worked to burnish her husband's memory, and during the following decades Custer and his troops came to be considered heroic figures in American history. The battle, and Custer's actions in particular, have been studied extensively by historians.^[15] <u>Little Bighorn Battlefield National Monument</u> honors those who fought on both sides.
